Grenfell Campus staff are happy to assist with this process.)</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The dormitory rooms (\$1711-\$1821/semester) are double (with each student having his/her/their own locked room) with a shared washroom and refrigerator. • Students in the chalet apartments (\$1953/semester) share a 4-bedroom unit. • Students in the dormitory rooms share a communal kitchen or dine in the pay-per-meal cafeteria. Each chalet apartment has two washrooms, a full-sized kitchen, dining area and living room. All on-campus accommodations include internet access (WiFi and wired), electricity and telephone services (long-distance charges extra). • Students should apply for on-campus housing by March 1 for Fall 2025 and by October 1 for Winter 2026, if possible. Language proficiency requirements

For full undergraduate exchange:

- TOEFL 79 or better overall (with at least 20 in reading and writing and no less than 17 in listening and speaking)
- 6.5 IELTS or better overall (with at least band 6 in each of reading and writing)
- CAEL 60 or better overall (with no band below 50 and at least two bands at 60 or better in reading/writing/listening/speaking)

Sub-scores required for IEBP-G Levels 1 and 2 are as follows:

- **Level 1:** IELTS (no sub-score less than 5 and a minimum writing score of 5.5); TOEFL (minimum writing score of 16); CAEL (minimum writing score of 40).
- **Level 2:** IELTS (no sub-score less than 5.5 and a minimum writing score of 6.0); TOEFL (minimum writing score of 18); CAEL (minimum writing score of 50).


<p>Students planning to continue their studies at Memorial University beyond IEBP-G</p>	<p>The following guidelines will be taken into consideration as a gauge of readiness for undergraduate study (including the undergraduate exchange program) at Memorial University:</p> <p>Students who wish to proceed to undergraduate study in a future semester who take IEBP-G alongside one undergraduate course (aka: IEBP-G Level 1) must achieve an 85% or higher on their ESL final progress report as well as a B or higher in their undergraduate course. In addition, such students must submit a writing portfolio for review in order to exit the program at the end of the semester. Students who successfully complete IEBP-G Level 1 but who do not attain the benchmarks noted above may proceed to IEBP-G Level 2 in the subsequent semester.</p> <p>Students who wish to proceed to undergraduate study in a future semester who take IEBP-G alongside two undergraduate courses (aka: IEBP-G Level 2) must achieve a 75% or higher on their ESL final progress report as well as a B or higher in both of their undergraduate courses. In addition, such students must submit a writing portfolio for review in order to exit the program. Students in IEBP-G Level 2 who do not meet these benchmarks at the end of the semester may repeat IEBP-G Level 2 in the subsequent semester, if there is space available.</p>

Additionally, the student should verify that the course is being offered in the semester they will be attending Grenfell. The Exchange Coordinator will then liaise with faculty and will inform students of the courses they are permitted to take. Students will then receive instruction on how to register for their approved courses.


	<p>Students are permitted to change courses only when the following conditions have been met:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) The student has arrived on campus 2) The student has attended at least one lesson 3) The student has met with the Exchange Coordinator to discuss the reason for changing the course and to recommend an appropriate alternative <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • For IEBP-G Level 1: In addition to their ESL classes (20 hours per week), students are enrolled as a group in one academic credit course (selected by the ESL Coordinator). • For IEBP-G Level 2: In addition to their ESL classes (15 hours per week), students are enrolled as a group in one academic credit course (selected by the ESL Coordinator) as well as a second academic credit course from a limited list provided by the ESL Coordinator.
Payment of fees	Fees are due on the first day of class for each semester. Fees may be paid by bank transfer through the Convera platform or by MasterCard/Visa on the Memorial Self-Service portal prior to arrival. After arrival, fees may be paid in cash, traveler's cheque or money order, in-person at our bursar's office. Students with Canadian bank accounts may also have other payment options.

More Information on the Intensive English Programs:

ESL program summary	<p>The Intensive English Program at Grenfell Campus (IEP-G) is offered at 3 levels: IEP-G, IEP-G Level 1, IEP-G Level 2. Students participating in this program will take part in <u>25 hours per week of English language instruction time</u> for the duration of the 12-week semester. The Intensive English Program at Grenfell instructs students in English use related to <u>academic, professional, and personal purposes</u>. All levels of the Intensive English Program at Grenfell are <u>full-time, non-credit bearing programs</u>. The Intensive English Program is available in-person or completely online.</p> <p>The Intensive English Bridge Program at Grenfell Campus (IEBP-G) is offered at 2 levels: IEBP-G Level 1 and IEBP-G Level 2. These are programs of academic English study, designed to prepare students to meet the language demands of full-time university course work. In the Intensive English Bridge Program (Levels 1 and 2), students are <u>permitted to take one or two undergraduate, 3-credit courses alongside their English language instruction time</u>. Level 1 students take 20 hours of English language instruction time per week alongside 1 undergraduate courses. Level 2 students take 15 hours of English language instruction time per week alongside 2 undergraduate courses. IEBP-G Level 1 may be taken in-person or completely online. IEBP-G Level 2 is currently only offered in-person (occasionally with some online components).</p>
ESL class sizes	In-person classes are capped at 18 students. Online classes are capped at 22 students.
ESL program components	<p>All levels and streams of the program include the following components:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Integrated skills lessons (reading, writing, listening, and speaking) • Discussion sessions (in small groups, with undergraduate student leaders) • Culture and society lessons • Grammar and vocabulary lessons • Language lab sessions • Academic writing lessons <p>*IEBP-G students also participate in tutorials for their academic credit course taken as a group. *IEP-G students also take supplement classes such as Current Affairs and Language Through Literature.</p>
English-only policy	Students are expected to use English at all times when participating in any component of ESL programming including courses, labs, supervised discussion sessions and organized activities. Students are also strongly encouraged to use as much English as possible outside of class and to take advantage of social and cultural activities on-campus and in the community. Grenfell Campus staff make great efforts to facilitate these types of campus and community interactions.

Campus facilities	<p>The Arts and Science building on the Grenfell Campus of Memorial University houses the offices and classrooms for the School of Arts and Social Science, the School of Science and the Environment, as well as the language laboratory, science labs, administrative offices for the campus (Office of the Registrar, the Bursar's Office) and recreational facilities. <p>Community Information</p>	<p>Corner Brook is a small city with a population of approximately 20,000. Due to Corner Brook's position as a retail centre for Western Newfoundland, it has the amenities of a much larger city, including shopping malls, a cinema, recreational and cultural facilities. Grenfell Campus is located approximately 1.5 kilometres from Corner Brook's downtown core, which has numerous shops, businesses and restaurants. The Corner Brook Stream Trails, a network of scenic walking paths around the city, can be accessed from campus, and Marble Mountain ski resort is located just a 10-minute drive from campus. <p>Support for international students</p>	<p>Grenfell Campus offers the services of an Exchange Coordinator, ESL Coordinator and International Student Programming Coordinator to inbound students. Some of the services provided by these individuals may include (but are not limited to): assistance with course registration and housing application, pre-arrival inquiries, airport greeting upon arrival, peer-correspondent program, international student orientation, holiday programs, workshops for student development, international/multiculturalism events, and hospitality club. Additionally, the IEP/IEBP-G program hires student assistants to coordinate activities and community involvement for students.</p>
<p>How to get to Grenfell Campus</p>	<p>Corner Brook is a 40-minute drive from the nearest airport, Deer Lake Regional (YDF). From outside of Canada, students will clear customs in cities such as Toronto, Montreal, Halifax or St. John's, then catch a domestic connecting flight to Deer Lake Airport. Deer Lake Airport is serviced by Air Canada, which has several codeshare partners internationally with Star Alliance. (www.aircanada.com or www.staralliance.com). <p>Advice on selecting students for Grenfell Campus, Memorial University</p>	<p>Because we are a small campus, in a smaller city, we recommend Grenfell as an option for students who are independent and adventurous. Students interested in outdoor activity, as well as community and campus involvement, tend to do very well at Grenfell Campus. Our class sizes are small and the campus is very friendly, so our campus is a good location for students who want the opportunity to improve their English language skills, experience a university lifestyle, and a new culture. Our city does have good amenities for a city of its size; however, students interested in a more urban experience (shopping, restaurants, etc.) are likely to find our location challenging.</p>
